Annual tournament pits parent-child duos against each other

Thirteen boys, 7 girls, 17 dads, three moms and one grandpa were on the course at the Prairie Club on Saturday, Aug. 25, playing in the fourth annual Parent/Child Golf Tournament.

"This was our biggest year," said Kristen Kechik, operations manager at the club. "We sold out."

It was a 9-hole tournament with three divisions — ages 5-6, ages 7-10, and ages 11 and older. The rules stipulated that the children hit at least one of the shots on par-3 holes and at least two on par-4s.

Ryan Ramos, a 9-year-old who attends Hoffman School, said what he liked best about the tournament was "playing on a team with my dad."

The son of Art Ramos said he didn't know any of the other kids going into the tournament, "but I made new friends."

Although Team Ramos failed to finish first, the father-and-son duo put on an impressive performance, shooting a 35 on the course. Then Ryan lowered their score by earning a couple of bonus points for tossing a golf ball into a bucket.

Nick Savage, of Glenview, and his 5-year-old son, Jack, were the winners in the 5- and 6-year-old division; Greg Bradshaw, of Palatine, and his 10-year-old daughter, Eliza, were the champions in the 7- to 10 year-old division; and Glenview's Gary Schuh and son Kevin, an 11-year-old sixth-grader at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, were victorious in the 11-and-older division.

The Schuh twosome finished in spectacular style, carding an eagle on the par-

4 ninth hole. Gary drove the green and Kevin followed with a 35-foot putt.

"First time in this tournament and first time to try it as father-son in any event," Gary said. "Kevin plays other sports, but he's an avid golfer."

Greg Bradshaw said this was the fourth parent/child tournament event he and Eliza have played this year.

"We'd won other events, but not this one until today," he said.

Another daughter, 7-year-old Chloe, played
