The [Glenview Park District](#) announces a unique opportunity for those living in one of the busiest metropolitan areas in the country to step away from hustle and bustle, walk into a traditional big red barn, see livestock close-up and enjoy a hearty breakfast on June 8 at Historic Wagner Farm, 1510 Wagner Rd. They can also watch a livestock show, where area teens show their 4-H animals and compete for ribbons and cash prizes.

"There will be lambs and pigs and dairy cows and beef cows. We're bringing in professional judges. It's a neat way for the public to learn about what that experience is like for the kids," said Sarah Schoeneberg, Historic Wagner Farm Program Manager. This is the show's fourth year.

The Wagner Farm Stock Show coincides with the 17th Annual Wagner Farm Dairy Breakfast. From 8 a.m. -1 p.m., Egg Harbor Cafe will be flipping hot pancakes and serving eggs directly from a sizzling griddle to your

plate. The stock show gets underway at approximately 9 a.m. with the Glenview Clovers going up against other 4-H clubs from the greater Chicago area.

In honor of June Dairy Month, the day is a fun and educational way for families, children and people interested in agriculture to learn how food gets from the farm to the table. In addition to the stock show and dairy breakfast, there will be hayrides, lawn games, dairy demonstrations and hands-on activities.

Tickets can be purchased in advance at glenviewparks.org/dairy-breakfast or at Historic Wagner Farm the day of the event. \$10 adults, \$5 for children ages 2-10, and free for children under 2.

About Wagner Farm

The Glenview Park District's 18.6-acre Wagner Farm, located at 1510 Wagner Rd., is one of the last working dairy farms in Cook County and is open to the public for recreation and learning. The farm provides a unique opportunity for families to learn about our farming heritage and experience first-hand "the way things used to be."
